Who are we?

The National Authority for Regulating and Monitoring Public Procurement (N.A.R.M.P.P.) is a public institution, subordinated to the Prime-Minister

The N.A.R.M.P.P. has as fundamental role the elaboration, promotion and implementation of public procurement policies and fulfills the following:

- Drafting the public procurement strategy;
- Regulation of the award procedures of public procurement contracts;
- Monitoring, analysis, evaluation and supervision of the awarding process of public procurement contracts;
- Representation of Romania in the advisory committees, working groups and communication networks organized by European institutions;
- Methodological counseling of contracting authorities in the award process of public procurement contracts, with support role for the correct application of the applicable law;
- Initiating/sustaining projects or training actions of the personnel involved in the specific activities of public procurement, with support role in developing the administrative capacity for the implementation of legislation at the level of the contracting authorities.



Recent activities

Developing standardized tendering documentation for public procurement contracts

Project coordinated by ANRMAP under the supervision of the Prime Minister and monitored by the Directorate General Regional Policy of the EU Commission.

- The aim of the initiative is to eliminate the majority of complaints and subjective issues in the elaboration of tendering documentation
- The initiative will increase the transparency of the public procurement process
- The initiative will be implemented via legislative acts
